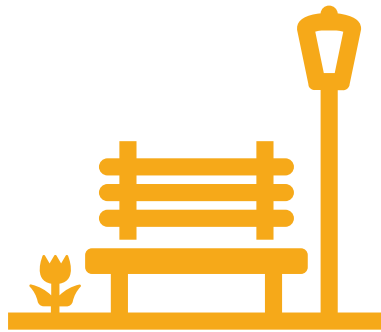

ELIGIBLE PROJECT TYPES



Public Improvement Projects

Streetscape and transportation improvements, recreational trails, new and upgraded parks, plazas, public art, green infrastructure, and other public realm projects.



New Development and/or Rehabilitation of Existing Downtown Buildings

Development and redevelopment of real property for mixed-use, commercial, residential, not for profit, or public uses. Development / redevelopment should result in employment opportunities, housing choices or other community services.



Small Project Grant Fund

A locally managed matching small project for small downtown projects, such as façade improvements, building renovations, business assistance, or public art.



Branding and Marketing

Downtown branding and marketing projects that target residents, tourists, investors, developers and visitors.

INELIGIBLE PROJECT TYPES + ACTIVITIES

- **Planning Activities.** All NY Forward funds must be used to implement projects.
 - **Operations and Maintenance.** Funds cannot be used for on-going or routine expenses, such as staff salaries and wages, rent, utilities, and property up-keep.
 - **Pre-award Costs.** Reimbursement for costs incurred before the completion of the Strategic Investment Plan and the announcement of funding awards is not permitted.
 - **Property Acquisition.** NY Forward cannot be used for property acquisition.
 - **Training and Other Program Expenses.** NY Forward funds cannot be used to cover continuous costs, such as training costs and expenses related to existing programs.
 - **Expenses related to Existing Programs.** NY Forward funds cannot supplement existing programs or replace existing resources.

PROJECT MATCH REQUIREMENTS + DECARBONIZATION

- 25% minimum project match for private projects (per NY Forward program)
 - * *Proposed projects with a greater sponsor match may be more competitive during the project evaluation process*
 - No match requirement for public or non-profit projects
 - Total project cost must be a minimum of \$75,000 (except small project fund)
 - LPC can set higher match requirements at their own discretion
 - New construction, building additions over 5,000 SF and some substantial renovation over 5,000 SF will be required to meet decarbonization standards

CALL FOR PROJECTS OVERVIEW



- Open Call for Projects provides an opportunity for community members, property owners, and business owners to submit projects for consideration.
- The Open Call For Projects:
 - Village of Heuvelton, July 28 – September 2, 2026
 - Town of Moriah August 5 – September 9, 2026
- NY Forward program requires a minimum 25% match for private projects.
- The total project cost must be a minimum of \$75,000 to submit a Project Form.
- Projects <\$75,000 should submit a Small Project Fund Interest Form to demonstrate support for the fund.
- Not all solicited projects will be selected.

SECTION 5.4

PROJECT PROFILES

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Project Title

The project title must begin with an action-oriented statement and should succinctly describe the "what" and "where." Project titles must:

- Begin with an action (Transform, Expand, Establish, Renovate, Build, Create, etc.)
- Name the outcome if applicable (Public Plaza, Job Training Center, Small Project Fund, Mixed-Use, Housing)
- Name the location if applicable (Historic Edwards Building, Historic Cannon Building, Long-Vacant Historic Buildings, Corner of Main & Clinton, 78 Bridge Street)

- Examples**
- Construct Mixed-Use Development on West Water Street
 - Transform City Centre into an Indoor Market and Performance Space
 - Renovate 13-15 Central Avenue to Create New Office Space

DRI/NY Forward Funding Request and Total Project Cost

Each project profile must state the requested amount to be paid by DRI/NY Forward funds, the total project cost, and the percentage of total costs requested. It is expected that the DRI/NY Forward funding request for private projects will represent just a component of the overall project budget. The total project cost should reflect costs paid for by DRI/NY Forward funds, as well as private equity or financing, tax credits, or other public funding or financing. Those sources of additional funds should be listed in the project budget later in the profile.

HOW ARE PROJECTS EVALUATED?

The LPC will evaluate all submitted projects based on the NYS NY Forward Program criteria and goals and local goals:

- **Eligible Project.** Projects must be one of the eligible project types.
 - **Alignment with Local and State Goals.** Projects must advance the goals established by the LPC and align with the State's program goals.
 - **Catalytic Effect.** Projects must have a significant positive impact on the revitalization of the community 's downtown.
 - **Project Readiness.** Projects should be well-developed and ready to proceed as soon as possible upon the award of funding.
 - **Cost Effectiveness.** Projects must represent an effective and efficient use of public resources.
 - **Co-Benefits.** Projects must result in benefits to the community, beyond just the project developer, such as: additional economic activity and improved quality of life.
 - **Community Criteria.** The LPC may set additional criteria for their review (LPC #2 discussion).
-

FINAL SLATE OF RECOMMENDED PROJECTS

- The Final Slate of Projects takes into consideration feedback from the public and is finalized by the LPC.
 - NYS will make final decision on projects selected for funding.
 - The total amount of requested NY Forward funds submitted to the State for consideration will have a higher dollar amount than what will be awarded (\$6 - \$8 Million).
 - Projects included on the Final Slate of Projects are not guaranteed to be selected for funding.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOUR PROJECT IS SELECTED FOR FUNDING?

- All awards are provided as a reimbursement grant. Project sponsors must complete work before monies are provided.
 - Project sponsors will likely need to secure bridge financing to cover costs while project is being completed.
 - All awards are subject to State requirements, including Minority-and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) goals, competitive procurement, etc.

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How to Submit Your Project

1. Review the Eligibility Criteria and Project Requirement

on pages 3-5 learn about requirements for projects and to make sure your project is eligible to be considered for NY Forward funding.

2. Review the Local Vision, Goals, and Evaluation Criteria

The Local Planning Committee (LPC) will develop a local vision, goals, and evaluation criteria for downtown Heuvelton during this planning process, which will be published after LPC Meeting #2. Please visit the Vision & Goals tab at HeuveltonNYForward.com to learn about the vision and goals for the Village of Heuvelton's downtown. To review how the LPC and State will evaluate projects, please see pages 6 - 7 of this form.

3. Consider consulting with an Architect/Engineer/General Contractor/Vendor

To help define the project scope of work, review the existing conditions, code requirements, and design feasibility, and develop realistic budgets.

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Project Types & Requirements

It is expected that NY Forward funds will be used for capital projects that will transform the physical environment of the downtown in ways that will benefit current residents and future generations. However, certain non-capital projects or projects that may lead to capital investment will also be considered to the extent that they will contribute to the revitalization of the downtown. The following is a description of eligible and ineligible project types.

Eligible Project Types

- **Public Improvement Projects.** These may include projects such as streetscape and transportation improvements, recreational trails, wayfinding signage, new and upgraded parks, plazas, public art, green infrastructure, and other public realm projects that will contribute to the revitalization of the downtown.
- **New Development and/or Rehabilitation of Existing Downtown Buildings.** Projects in this category may include the development or redevelopment of real property for mixed-use, commercial, residential, not for profit, or public uses. Projects should have a visible and functional impact on the downtown, serving as catalytic or transformative projects that will provide employment opportunities, housing choices, and/or services for the community.
- **Small Project Fund.** A locally managed matching small project fund may be proposed to undertake a range of smaller downtown projects such as facade enhancements, building renovation improvements to commercial or mixed-use

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Project Requirements

The following are the requirements for projects to be considered for NY Forward funding. Recognizing several requirements must be met to qualify for NY Forward funding, each project sponsor will have access to technical support from State agencies and a consultant team to assist with project development (i.e. construction cost estimates, renderings, climate resilient design, meeting decarbonization requirements, etc).

- **Project Location.** Projects must be located within the Village of Heuvelton's boundary. If your project is located outside the NY Forward boundary, please provide a brief description of how the project relates to the downtown and supports the stated goals of the NY Forward. Minor boundary modifications may be considered by the LPC.
- **Project Timing.** Projects must be able to break ground within two years or sooner of receiving NY Forward funding.
- **Project Size and Scale.** Projects must be large enough to be truly transformative for the downtown area. Standalone NY Forward projects must be at least \$75,000 in total project cost.* **Projects less than \$75,000 can be submitted through this process as demonstration of demand for a Small Project Fund. If you have a project that is under \$75,000 in total project costs, please contact the consultant team at mhema@mjteam.com for more information.**
- **Project Funding.** Projects should have financial commitments largely secured or be able to demonstrate a clear path to securing sufficient financing. It is strongly encouraged that all projects, especially private projects, use non-NY Forward funds that leverage requested public funding. Projects that use other funding sources will be more competitive for funding awards. **For projects with a private sponsor, there is a minimum match requirement of 25% of the total project cost. There is no**

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Village of Heuvelton's Vision & Goals

The following draft vision was submitted in the Village of Heuvelton NY Forward application. Check the project website (www.HeuveltonNYForward.com) for updates to the vision and goals as the NY Forward process proceeds.

Draft Vision for Downtown

"By 2034, Heuvelton aims to be a vibrant community featuring small businesses and activities for adults, children, and families. Key spaces such as the boat launch and Pickens Hall will serve as focal points for residents of all ages. Continued robust access to municipal services - including the public library, fire department, and post office - will remain a priority. Local childcare and medical centers will operate successfully, and the downtown area will evolve into a cultural center marketed by new growth and development. Vacant properties will be repurposed to benefit the broader community and provide a diverse range of services.

Heuvelton envisions becoming a recreational destination, with enhancements including a new park and sports fields at the boat launch, increased engagement along the Oswegatchie River, and expanded trails within and surrounding the Village. Efforts to improve river water quality and reduce invasive species will unlock new recreational opportunities. Heuvelton Central School will continue to offer high quality education and extracurricular programs, anticipate higher enrollment, and secure increased funding. The Village is committed to maintaining its small-town values while embracing cultural trends, aspiring to become a premier destination within the County."

Alignment with the Village of Heuvelton's vision and goals will be a criterion that the LPC will be using to evaluate submitted projects.

The following criteria have been established by the Village of Heuvelton's Local Planning Committee (LPC) for project evaluation. These criteria were developed based on the State's evaluation criteria, which are listed at the bottom of the page. The LPC will use these criteria when discussing and evaluating proposed projects throughout the NY Forward planning process.

- Build a diverse population, with residents and workers supported by complementary diverse housing and employment opportunities.
- Grow the local property tax base.
- Provide amenities that support and enhance downtown living and quality of life.
